Our procedures:

We keep a log, per California law, including the name of the deceased, date the remains are received, date location of scattering, and name and address of person who is authorizing the scattering and the manner and means of the remains scattering.

When we are flying I will have a safety pilot also in the plane. We photograph the metal ID tag along with the GPS coordinates. This ensures that there is a record and a witness to the scattering. We always try to have video running on a wing camera, but occasionally technical issues could prevent the scattering being recorded. We are all about safety of the pilots first and video and/or pictures second.

In addition, we are very safe about weather conditions and will wait for the best weather, when possible. Certain times of the year are more difficult to schedule because of the weather conditions.

Scattering is performed using a special chute placed through the door opening and only one set of remains are scattered at a time, which prevents commingling of any ashes.

After the scattering we issue certificates with date of and the approximate location of the scattering. Certificates are mailed to the family and to the funeral home. We then process any permits, mail them out and later notify the Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with the law.
